RISKS: Ionizing radiation may cause damage to the cells in your body. This is usually very minor and does not cause any serious damage, however, large doses may cause the cells to become cancerous. A very low dose x-ray, such as a chest x-ray, has a tiny risk. Your doctor is aware of the risks and benefits of x-rays and should always balance the possible benefits of you having the test. It is always appropriate for you to have the x-ray or scan if it benefits you. Finding out if you have something wrong with you and the best way to treat it outweighs the very small risk of the scan. Imaging procedures involving ionizing radiation are not usually recommended for pregnant women, but can be performed in an emergency. If you are concerned about the risks, talk to your doctor before the examination. You have the right to refuse an examination and may do so if you wish.
